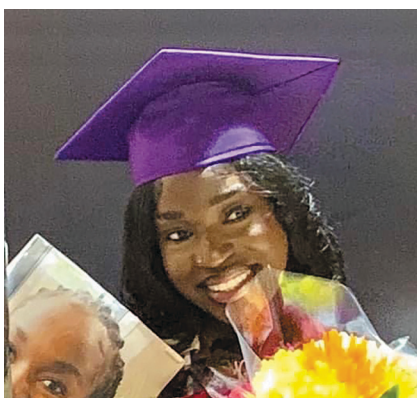
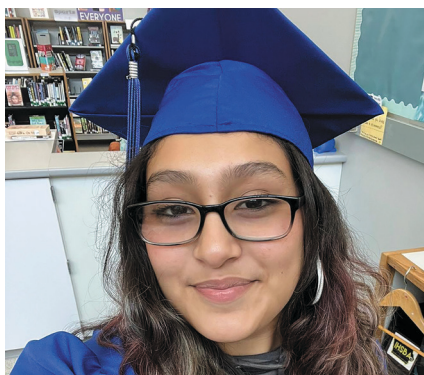

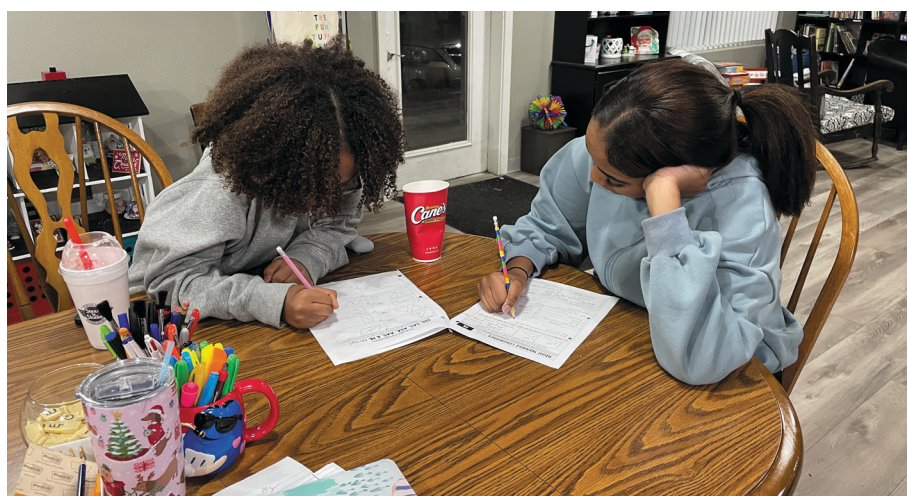

Iowa LEAP (Iowa Leadership, Education, & Advocacy Project) is a 501c.3 nonprofit organization committed to helping students become the first in their families to pursue higher education through college or the trades after high school. The majority of our students are eligible for free/reduced lunch and/or English Language Learners. Iowa LEAP strives to empower and support students so they can overcome obstacles that stand between them and their future dreams for college and a career.

We focus on providing academic support and mentoring to students in grades 6-12 who will become the first in their families to continue their education after high school graduation. This support includes academic tutoring, executive skills coaching, navigating the college application process; and career counseling. Iowa LEAP continues to support students from the college application process through college graduation.
